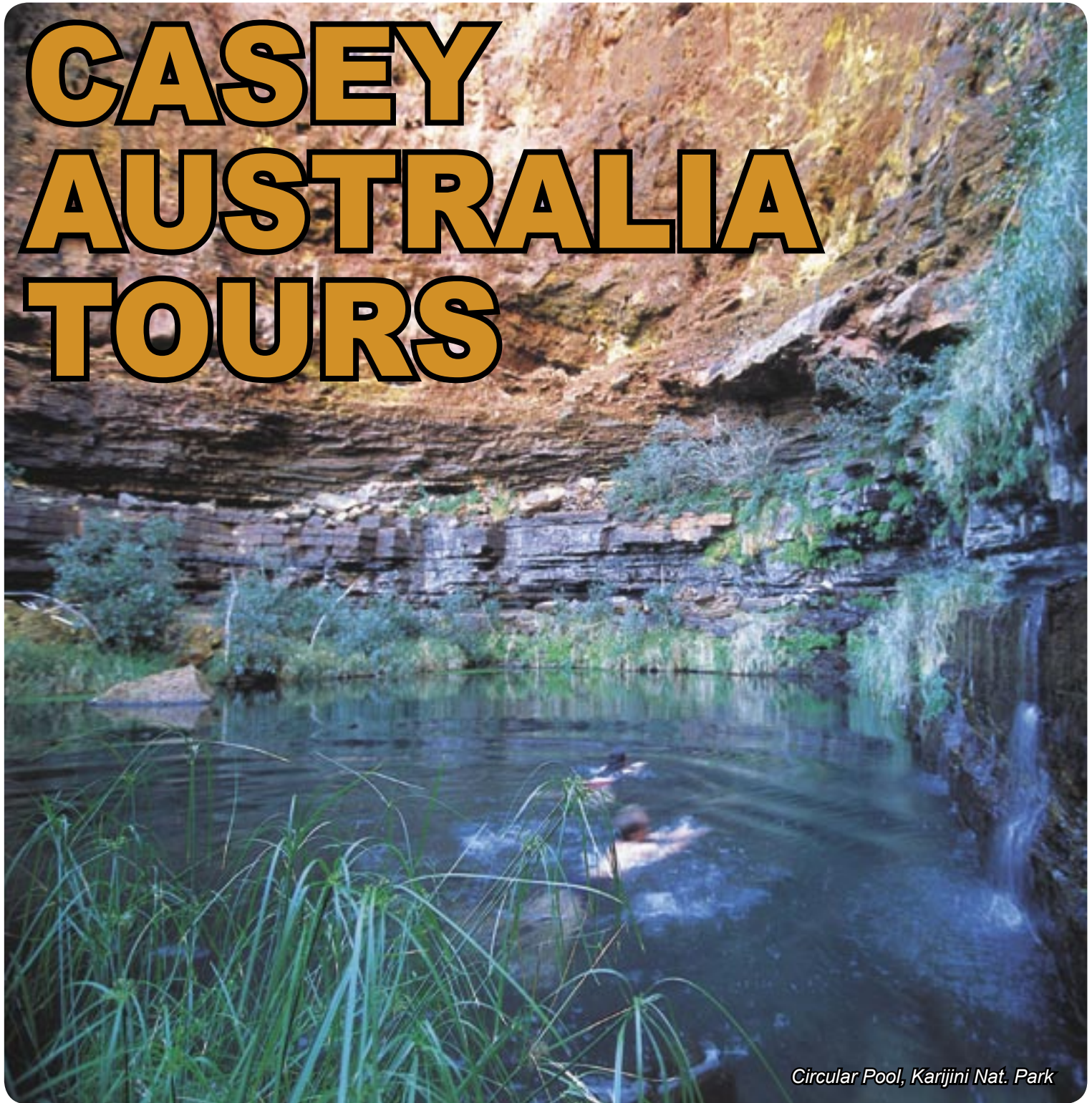

General Information For All Tours

1. Bookings & Payment

Bookings can be made by completing the booking form on this brochure or by contacting us by phone, mail or e-mail. Bookings can be made with a \$100 per person deposit. Full fare is payable one month prior to departure or two months if the tour contains an airfare. Bookings within the full fare payable period require full payment. We accept payments by cash, bank cheque, personal cheque, money order, bank transfer or credit card (Visa, MasterCard). Payments by credit card over \$200 are not accepted unless a 2% of value service fee is included.

2. Departure Points

- Land based tours depart from and return to the Westrail Centre (Interstate Rail Terminal) East Perth.
- Tours with air travel depart from the Perth Airport.
- Passengers may also depart from our O'Connor depot by arrangement.

3. Fare Protection

A Fare Protection Plan is available which is designed to protect your fare should you or a member of your family take ill before or whilst on tour. Details are available when booking.

4. Your Health

We have no age limit or health standard. We do however trust to your good sense. We ask that if you do have a condition which may affect you while on tour to inform our staff on booking. We suggest, if you are elderly or have recently had a serious illness, to consult your doctor to see if you are fit to travel. Because of the variety of temperatures encountered on the tours and the fact that you travel in close confinement with other people you may consider having a flu injection before departure, particularly on winter tours.

5. Coaches

Casey Australia Tours, operate only coaches with onboard toilet, reclining seats, air conditioning, tinted windows, comfortable air suspension & chilled drink fountain. Perth City tour and airport transfers may be conducted by other companies in different vehicles.

6. Pricing

All prices are based on twin share accommodation. Single Supplements are available on most tours. All inclusions are stated at the beginning of each tour description and in the day by day itinerary.

7. Airfares

We use air services of Qantas, Virgin Blue, Jetstar, Skywest, Tiger and Air New Zealand. Carrier and flight times are provided one month prior to departure.

8. Alteration of Flights

If you wish to have a different departure or return flight from the scheduled flight a fee of \$50 per person is payable along with any increase in the cost of the new flight from the scheduled flight.

Eastern States Passengers

1. Departure Date

The departure dates shown on each tour are the date that the tour leaves Perth. The departure date for a package will be within one or two days from this date.

2. Extended Stay

You may delay your return and use your return airfare on another date. Accommodation and other expenses are at your cost after breakfast on the last itinerary day. N.B. If new return flight is more expensive than the scheduled flight the difference is payable by you.

Types of Accommodation

Motels Tours

Generally 3 star or better. Rooms will be allocated on a twin share basis. (Single Supplement available) Breakfast- Continental. Lunches - Not included. Dinner- In general two or three course evening meals are provided at the motels. There are exceptions such as restaurant, club or picnic meals.



Cabin / Budget Motel Tours

Many cabins will be motel rooms. Some cabins may be a single room with ensuite, TV etc and the equivalent of a medium motel. Others may be a room with beds. Others may be two or three bedrooms with shared toilet, bathroom, and living area; a small house. Rooms will be allocated on a twin share basis. Single Supplement available (single supplement in an apartment means single room not a single apartment.)



Breakfast- Continental
Lunches - Not included.

Dinner- In general two or three course evening meals are provided by our staff or a club.

Cabins in Mount Augustus

Cabins are mining style 'dongas' and do not provide ensuite.

Cabins in Coober Pedy

Cabins are underground and do not provide ensuite.

Cabins in Mungeranie & Ray Station

Do not provide ensuite.

Camping Tours

Tents will be allocated on a twin share basis (optional single tent \$80 per tour). Tents are 180cm high 270cm square at the base, fully floored, and very simple to erect, four pegs a pole in the middle and the tent is up. Passengers are not expected to erect their own tent. There is electric floodlighting of the area.



Sleeping is on foam mattresses (optional camp stretcher \$40 per tour).

Breakfast - Continental

Lunch - Not included.

Dinner - In general two or three course evening camp meals provided by our staff.

Day 1: Fly from Perth to **Auckland**, where on arrival we are met by our coach and travel north to **Whangarei**. Settling in around midday for a rest after our flight.

Day 2: We head to the **Bay of Islands** for an optional boat cruise on this magnificent natural beauty, then down to Auckland. Home for two nights. (N.B. Optional boat cruise approx \$70)

Day 3: A day touring Auckland and viewing its spectacular harbour. We visit **Devonport**, the oldest settlement on the North Shore, travelling over by ferry, the city centre and Mt Eden. Also free time to wander at will. N.B. Ferry trip to Devonport included in your fare.

Day 4: We travel to the famous **Waitomo** Glowworm Caves for an exciting Cave Tour by boat. Onto **Rotorua** for 2 nights. N.B. Cave Tour included in your fare.

Day 5: A day in Rotorua visiting the 'Maori Experience', observing bubbling mud pools, spouting geysers and learning about New Zealand's Maori heritage. N.B. 'Maori Experience' included in your fare.

Day 6: Delightful drive along the shore of **Lake Taupo** then a scenic drive to **Wellington**, the capital of New Zealand.

Day 7: We have a full tour of Wellington and time to explore the city at will, then we cross Cook Strait to the South Island by ferry, landing at Picton. N.B. Ferry trip included in your fare. Evening meal not included.

Day 8: From **Blenheim** we take a beautiful scenic coastal drive between the sea and

the Kaikoura Range to **Christchurch**, the South Islands' largest city. Afternoon tour of Christchurch.

Day 9: Leaving Christchurch, we travel through the rich Canterbury Plain farming area to **Lake Tekapo** with spectacular views across to the Southern Alps and Mt. Cook. We visit the famous "Church of the Good Shepherd" and are able to take a delightful walk along the lake. Optional flight over Mt. Cook available. N.B. Flight over Mt. Cook not included in your fare. Cost approx \$200 NZ.

Day 10: Leaving Lake Tekapo we follow the highland roads past the beautiful mountain lakes of the central South Island and on through the Takitimu Mountains passing Lake Wakatipu and pleasant farmlands to **Te Anau** on the edge of Fiordland National Park.

Day 11: Onto one of the Eight Natural Wonders of the World – **Milford Sound**. Here we take a marvellous boat cruise in this pristine corner of the world. In the afternoon to **Queenstown**. N.B. Boat cruise included in your fare.

Day 12: The area around Queenstown is breathtakingly picturesque. Here we enjoy a superb lake cruise. Also you can take a chair lift ride for a spectacular view of Queenstown. N.B. Boat cruise included in your fare. Chair lift ride not included

Day 13: Continuing north along the scenic mountain roads past Lake Hawea and Mount Aspiring National Park we come to the slow moving river of ice.

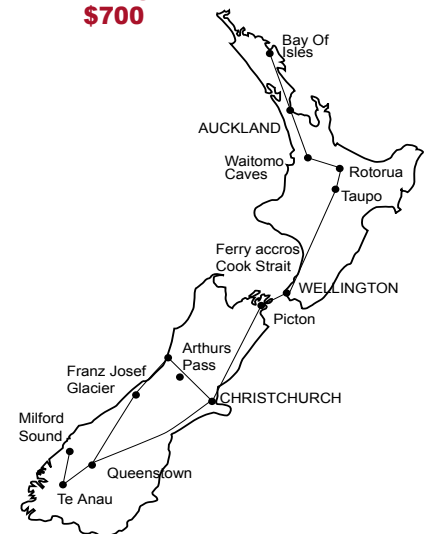

Day 1: Travel via **Albany** Highway through Kojonup and Mt. Barker to arrive in Albany for lunch. Afternoon tour of Albany City, visit to Mt. Clarence, Whaling Station Museum and The Gap. N.B. Entry to Whaling Station included.

Day 2: From Albany we head onto **Bremer Bay**. A delightful town with very beautiful beaches and scenery in the area. Later it is onto Jerramungup, Ravensthorpe and **Esperance**.

Day 3: A full day in Esperance commences with a marvellous boat cruise in the harbour and nearby islands. After lunch some free time to explore Esperance. We take a trip along the coast, Twilight Drive and return to Esperance via Pink Lake. N.B. Boat Cruise included.

Day 4: North through Salmon Gums for Morning Tea at **Norseman** at the Western end of the Eyre Highway. We head to the **Nullarbor** past Balladonia and Cocklebiddy.

Day 5: Continuing across the Nullarbor into South Australia stopping to over look the cliffs of the **Great Australian Bight** and onto **Ceduna** for our evening stop.

Day 6: From Ceduna we visit Streaky Bay on our way down the Flinders Highway towards **Port Lincoln**, named after the home town of Matthew Flinders who first visited this area in 1802.

Day 7: We drive up the East Coast of the Eyre Peninsula via **Cowell** to **Whyalla**, which was founded as Hummock's Hill in 1901 by the Broken Hill Proprietary Company (BHP) as the end of a tramway bringing iron ore from the Middleback

Ranges. Next we visit **Port Augusta**, the Outback Gateway at the head of the Spencers Gulf. Later onto **Adelaide**.

Day 8: Our tour of Adelaide which was founded in 1836 and planned by Colonel William Light starts with Port Adelaide then the City Centre. We have free time in the city followed by an optional tram ride to Glenelg where we enjoy Fish & Chips by the sea.

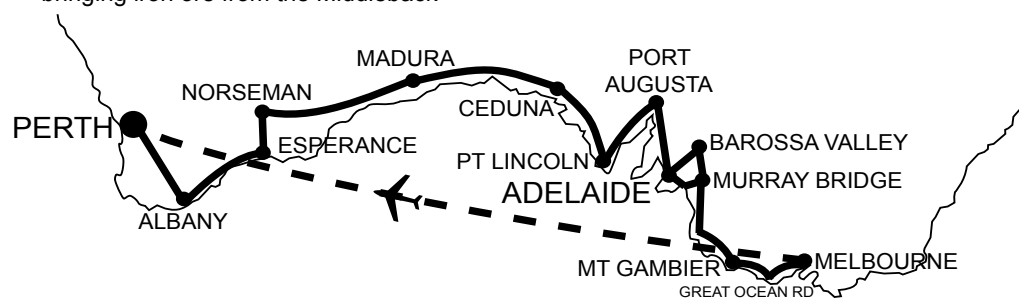
Day 9: Through the Adelaide Hills to the picturesque town of **Birdwood**, visiting the National Car Museum (optional), the premier car museum in Australia. This is not just a museum for car enthusiasts, it contains many unique vehicles of great historical importance. From Birdwood we continue through the beautiful Barossa Valley to the picturesque towns of **Angaston** and **Nuriootpa**. In the afternoon stop for a wine tasting in this world famous wine district. N.B. Entry into Car Museum not included in your fare. Wine tasting included in your fare.

Day 10: Back to the lovely Adelaide Hills today to **Hahndorf**, a quaint town reflecting its colourful German Heritage. Later onto **Mannum** for a cruise on the Murray River. After our cruise off to **Murray Bridge**. NB. River Cruise included in your fare.

Day 11: Through **Tailem Bend** then along the edge of The Coorong, home to massive flocks of birds that have travelled here from as far away as Siberia and Alaska. Onto **Mt Gambier**; its volcanic Blue Lake is very interesting. Onto **Portland**, one of the earliest settlements in Victoria and home of Alcoa's huge aluminium smelter. Spending the night at **Warrnambool**.

Day 12: Recognised as one of the world's most scenic drives, the **Great Ocean Road** follows the stunning coastline of Victoria's south-west. Stretching 243 kilometres from **Allansford** to **Torquay**, the road winds along cliff tops, up to breathtaking headlands, down onto the edge of beaches, across river estuaries and through lush rainforests offering panoramic views of Bass Strait and the Southern Ocean at every turn. Onto the industrial city of **Geelong**.

Day 13: We have a morning tour of the sights of **Melbourne** and flight home.

Day 1: CP To Cunderdin, visiting the original pumping stations (now museum) for the Goldfields Pipe Line. Onto Merredin, Southern Cross and the historic town of Coolgardie. N.B. Entry at Cunderdin included.

Day 2: CP A tour of Kalgoorlie, including the Super Pit, Boulder and the historic Two Up Ring. To Menzies, Leonora and the Sons of Gwalia Mine and camp at Laverton.

Day 3: We leave the bitumen and into the Great Victoria Desert past Warburton, a bush camp and a wonderful experience in the remoteness of the desert.

Day 4: CP Onto impressive range country in the Gibson Desert, named after explorer Alfred Gibson. Into the Giles Weather Station then on past Docker River and the Hull River to Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) and camp at Yulara.

Day 5: CP An interesting day at Uluru. Fly over it, wander around it, visit the National

Park display, Yulara Village and view the sunset on the Rock. A great day. N.B. Flight over Uluru not included. Cost approximately \$185.

Day 6: CP Off to Kings Canyon. Which is a superb example of rich red Central Australian landscape. You have an afternoon to walk it as you will.

Day 7: CAB Off early to the Alice then onto the very impressive Standley Chasm and Simpsons Gap.

Day 8: CAB We take you to the original Telegraph Station, then drop you in town for you to wander. Weather permitting you may take an optional balloon trip with Spinifex Ballooning. Cost approx. \$245.

Day 9: CAB South over the South Australian border to Coober Pedy. N.B. Cabins in Coober Pedy are underground, do not supply linen and do not provide ensuite.

Day 10: CAB Coober Pedy is a fascinating

place. One of the biggest towns in S.A, it is home to 92% of Australia's opals. People live underground to escape the summer heat. A morning tour and Opal display. Afternoon free time to explore.

Day 11 CP Onto the Oodnadatta Track with numerous former small settlements that serviced the Ghan. We pass Lake Eyre and lunch at Marree, a major centre on the Ghan Railway. To the coal mining town of

Leigh Creek, then to Hawker for 2 nights.

Day 12: CP A great drive through the spectacular Flinders Ranges, where some of the best Outback Scenery in Australia abounds. Wilpena Pound is a special spot.

Day 13: CP Via Pichi-Richi Pass to Port Augusta, Onto Ceduna then to the Nullarbor and toward Western Australia.

Day 14: CP Well and truly on the way home now we have our last night at Norseman.

Day 15: Time to go home now. We arrive in Perth after a most enjoyable tour.

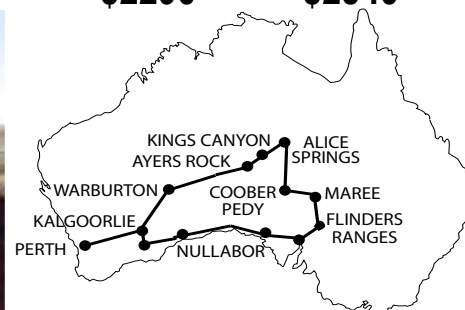

14 DAY ICONIC TOWNS OF AUSTRALIA

CABIN / MOTEL TOUR

Day 1: Fly to Melbourne mid morning and depart for **Ballarat** in the heart of the Victorian Goldfields which made Victoria the wealthiest of the six colonies in the 19th Century.

Day 2: Ballarat with its grand buildings of the Goldfields era. We visit the Eureka Stockade and Sovereign Hill Township, a marvellous recreation of early Ballarat. N.B. Eureka Stockade and Sovereign Hill included.

Day 3: **Bendigo** is another splendid example of the wealth of the Goldfields with many very grand buildings. From here we move onto the Murray River and **Echuca**, paddlesteamer capital of Australia. Founded in 1853, Echuca became the largest inland port in Australia. We visit the historic wharf and relive the days of paddlesteamers on the Murray.

Day 4: Following the Murray River today firstly to **Swan Hill** another historic river port for the paddlesteamers. From here we continue to one of the most delightful towns in Australia, **Mildura**, centre of the Sunraysia District, where irrigation was introduced to Australia in 1887 by the Chaffey Brothers. We have a delightful stay here including a cruise on a paddleboat. N.B. Paddle boat cruise included.

Day 5: Onto historic **Wentworth** at the junction of the Murray and Darling Rivers, north then on the Silver City Hwy to **Broken Hill** where Charles Rasp in 1883 found silver and started Australia's leading company BHP Biliton.

Day 6: A whole day in Broken Hill seeing the mining industry and town and a visit to the nearby town of **Silverton** where films such as "Mad Max" were shot.

Day 7: Along the Barrier Highway to the historic Darling River Port of **Wilcannia**, now only a shell of its former busy self. Onto **Cobar** where copper has been mined since 1870. Then north to **Bourke** on the Darling River.

Day 8: Bourke began in 1862 was the last outpost of civilization before the "Never Never" thus the saying "Back of Bourke". It was a port on the Darling River for the paddle steamers and when the rail arrived the town became the largest wool rail head in the world. Bourke is a great experience with its grand sandstone buildings and history. The new industry here is cotton production although that industry is in great trouble because of the shortage of water in the Murray Darling System. In the afternoon onto Queensland and **Cunnamulla**. Tonight we stay on a working Queensland Station with relaxing artesian springs. N.B. Cabins without ensuite.

Day 9: North to **Charleville** home of the Flying Doctor Base and original home of Cobb & Co for the building of its coaches. Onto **Blackall** on the Barcoo River and **Barcaldine**, the headquarters of the Great Shearers' Strike of 1891 which resulted in the formation of the Australia Labour Party. Onto **Longreach**.

Day 10: Longreach has great significance in Australia's history. It is the home of QANTAS Airlines (first office opened) and now boasts the very impressive Stockman's Hall of Fame which we visit. N.B. Entry to the Hall of Fame included.

Day 11: On the way through Barcaldine we stop in at the The Australian Workers Heritage Centre. Onto **Emerald** on the

Nogoa River. A decision made in 1948 by the British Food Corporation to grow sorghum in the area required the building of the huge Fairbairn Dam enabling the shift of the shire's economic focus from cattle to crops. It now produces over 25% of Queensland's cotton. Emerald of course is so named for the gemstones that are found in the area. N.B. Entry to Heritage Centre included in your fare.

Day 12: **Carnarvon Gorge** is in the Great Dividing Range. Our visit involves a delightful walk in a beautiful Australian Landscape. Onto **Roma** in the afternoon.

Day 13: Roma was the site of the first oil discoveries in Australia and a major landmark is the Big Rig, one of the original oil rigs in the area. The town is named after the wife of Governor Bowen, the Countess Diamantina Georgina Roma. Interestingly Georgina and Diamantina are the names of two of Queensland's largest rivers. In the afternoon onto **Toowoomba**.

Day 14: Toowoomba a beautiful City of over 100,000 on the Darling Downs. We spend the morning here then move onto Brisbane for our flight home after a marvellous Iconic Towns Adventure.

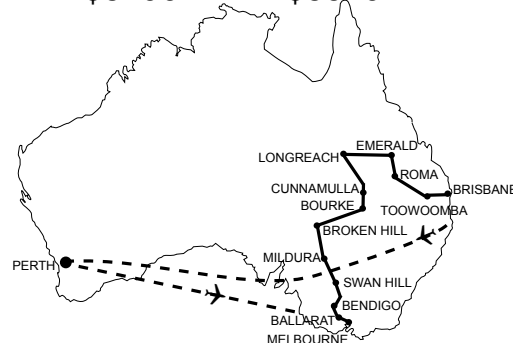

Day 1: Fly to **Sydney**, where we are met by our coach and transferred to our motel to settle in.

Day 2: A wonderful day in Sydney, visiting the beaches, Kings Cross, The Rocks, Opera House and the spectacular scenery of the Harbour. N.B. Evening meal not included

Day 3: Onto the **Blue Mountains**, **Katoomba**, its Three Sisters, Scenic Railway and Cable Car; a most impressive part of the world. Continuing through the Great Dividing Range, **Lightgow** and into **Bathurst** for a afternoon tour. N.B. Scenic Railway and Cable Car rides not included.

Day 4: To **Orange**, named in honour of the Prince of Orange, who later became the King of Holland and where almost half the NSW crop of apples are grown. North to **Dubbo** in the fertile Macquarie Valley. We visit the **Western Plains Zoo** where more than 1500 animals roam. NB. Western Plains Zoo entry included in your fare.

Day 5: Up the Castlereagh River to far Northern NSW we arrive at the Opal fields of **Lighting Ridge** home of Australia's national gem stone. Here beneath the ochre tinted clay the rarest opal of all, the black opal is unearthed.

Day 6: Into Queensland to **Dirranbandi**, home of the worlds largest privately owned irrigated cotton farm, Cubbie Station. To **St George**, **Surat** and **Roma** where over 100 years ago Australias first oil and gas reserves were accidentally discovered.

Day 7: Crossing through the Great Dividing Range we visit **Carnarvon Gorge**. Our visit involves a delightful walk in a beautiful Australian Landscape. Onto **Emerald** in the afternoon.



Day 8: At the Emerald Town Hall view an ancient fossilised tree aged 250 million years. Traveling to Lake Maraboon & Fairbairn Dam in the afternoon for a BBQ on the banks of the lake.

Day 9: Over the Tropic of Capricorn to **Clermont** and Blair Athol Mine, the worlds largest seam of steaming coal. Onto **Charters Towers** where gold was found in 1871 by a 12 year old aboriginal boy, Jupiter. From 1872 to 1899 Charters Towers operated the only Stock Exchange outside an Australian Capital City.

Day 10: Onto one of the great wonders of Australia "**The Undara Lava Tubes**" the worlds largest lava tube system. Spending the night at **Mt Suprize** N.B. Tour of Lava Tubes included in your fare.

Day 11: Firstly we visit a very impressive volcanic crater then onto the lovely mountain towns of **Atherton** and **Mareeba**. Later past Black Mountain to **Cooktown**.

Day 12: Captain Cook Beached his vessel the Endeavour in the mouth of the Endeavour River here for repairs in 1770. In this day there is time to wander this historic town. Including a vist to the James Cook Museum, regarded as the best regional museum in Australia. We enjoy a BBQ Dinner on the water for our last night.

Day 13: We head over the mountains, onto **Daintree**, where there is a leisurely boat cruise on the lush Daintree River. Then a delightful drive along the coast to **Port Douglas** and **Cairns** for our flight home. N.B. Boat cruise included.

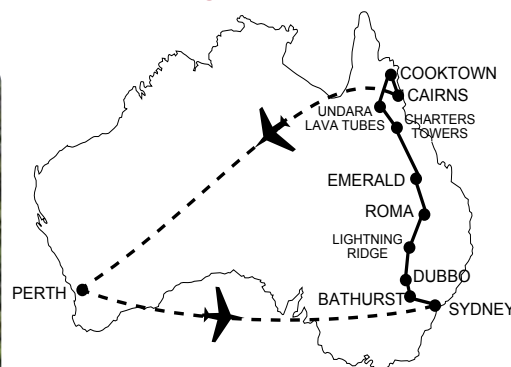

14 DAY OUTBACK QUEENSLAND & BIRDSVILLE TRACK TOUR

CABIN / MOTEL TOUR

Note - This is a tour in the remote Outback areas, where accommodation is limited. On two of the nights the accommodation does not have ensuite facilities. Ensuite facilities means toilet and shower inside the cabin or apartment.

Day 1: Fly to **Cairns** where we are met by our coach and transferred to our accommodation. N.B. Evening Meal not included.

Day 2: From Cairns onto Daintree, where there is a leisurely boat cruise on the lush **Daintree River**. Then a delightful drive along the coast to **Kuranda**, a delightful mountain town set in lush rainforest. In the afternoon our coach brings you back to Cairns. Alternatively you can return via the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway. The evening is free time in Cairns N.B. Boat cruise included. Skyrail trip included.

Day 3: Starting out over the Great Dividing Range we travel through **Atherton** to the **Undara Lava Tubes**. Massive caves formed by underground lava flows. Overnight at **Mount Surprise**. N.B. Tour of Lava Tubes included, Lunch Included.

Day 4: Onto **Georgetown** and the old gold mining town of **Croyden** then onto **Normanton** on the Norman River. In the late afternoon we travel to **Karumba** on the Gulf of Carpentaria to enjoy fish and chips as the sun sets over The Gulf. N.B. Lunch Included.

Day 5: We follow the Matilda Highway south, visiting **Cloncurry**, where the Royal Flying Doctors Service was launched with the first flight on 17 May 1928. The John Flynn Place Museum pays homage to this crucial part of Outback life.

Day 6: Australian history is paramount today. We visit **McKinlay** where much of the film Crocodile Dundee was shot. **Kynuna**,



near where Banjo Paterson wrote Waltzing Matilda. **Winton**, the birth place of QANTAS, to **Longreach** our home for two nights.

Day 7: Longreach has great significance in Australia's history. It is the home of QANTAS Airlines (first office opened) and now boasts the very impressive Stockman's Hall of Fame which we visit. N.B. Entry to the Hall of Fame included.

Day 8: From Longreach the tour heads to the little cattle town of **Windorah** in the Queensland Channel Country then on to **Ray Station**. (Cabin without ensuite)

Day 9: Ray Station was settled in 1874 by great grandparents Patsy & Sarah Tully nee Durack. Sarah's brother the famous Patsy Durack (Kings in Grass Castles) urged them to follow him to the Kimberley's. They declined. Situated in the heart of Boulder opal country near Quilpie, Ray station's 600sq km remains one of a select few properties in Australia never to have changed hands since white settlement. Mark & Sandra Tully tell the story of their family on this land. (Cabin without ensuite)

Day 10: West back through Windorah, past the Betoota Hotel Ruins then on to **Birdsville** a classic outback town. Staying at the Iconic Birdsville Hotel.

Day 11: Into South Australia along the famous Birdsville Track to the **Mungerannie** Hotel. South through the sand dunes to **Cooper Creek** which channels water from the Western Queensland Rivers into Lake Eyre. We move on along the Track to **Marree** at one time a major centre on the

Ghan Railway to Alice Springs. N.B. Lunch Included

Day 12: Through **Leigh Creek** which supplies the coal for the power stations at **Port Augusta**. At Parachilna we head into the **Flinders Ranges** for a visit to **Wilpena Pound**, staying in **Hawker** at the foot of the Flinders Ranges.

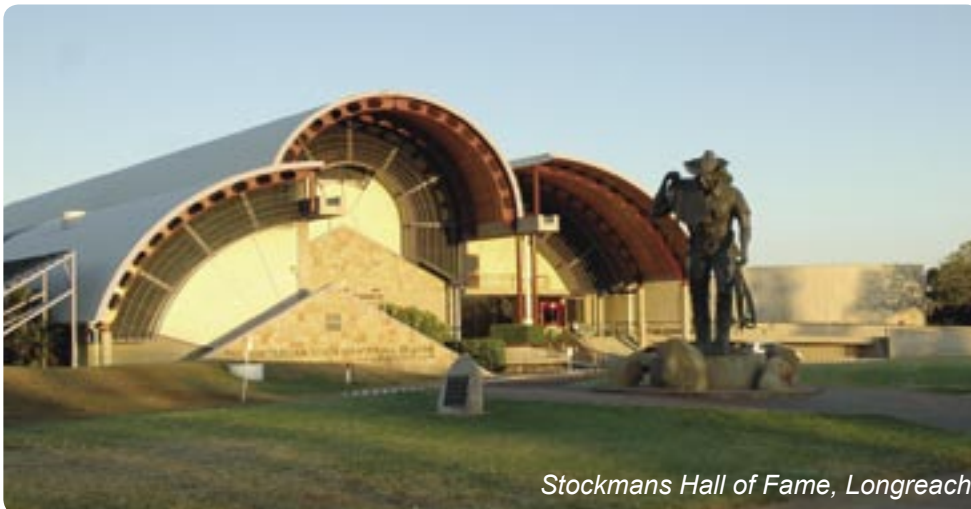
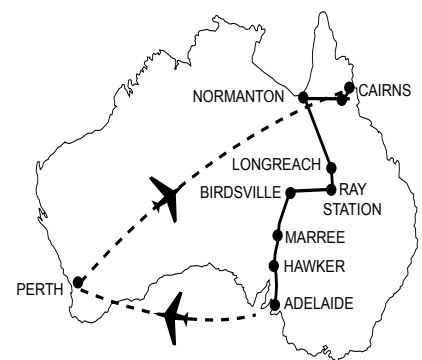
