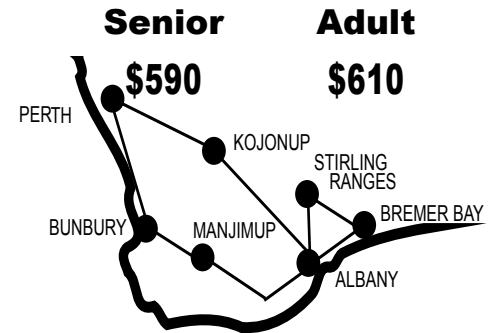

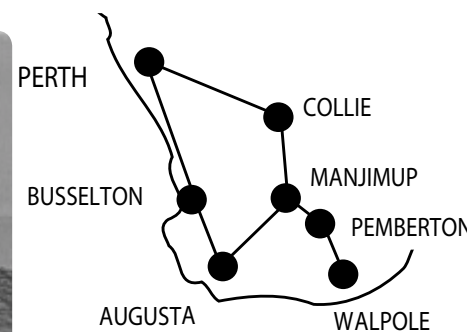

Note - This is a tour in the remote Outback areas, where accommodation is limited. On one of the nights the accommodation does not have ensuite facilities. Ensuite facilities means toilet and shower inside the cabin or apartment.

Day 1: Via the picturesque Swan Valley to New Norcia for a morning tea break and look around. On via Dalwallinu and lunch. Along the Great Northern Highway and the Paynes Find Pub we have a break, move onto the Gold Mining Town of Mt Magnet and our accommodation. (Budget motel with ensuite).

Day 2 Onto Cue, an historic goldmining town, then Meekatharra. We leave the bitumen travelling to Mt Gould Police Station, built in the late 1800' to police aboriginals, who were killing settlers' stock. Lunch, then onto Landor Station, famous for its bush race meeting. Onto Mt Augustus. (Cabins without ensuite).

Day 3 At Mt Augustus we enjoy a tour and visit to the nearby Lyons River and lunch. In the afternoon return to Mt Magnet. (Budget motel with ensuite).

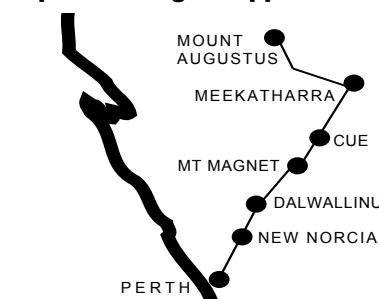
Day 4 Onto Yalgoo and a visit to Jokers Tunnel, (a mining drive through a hill from one side to the other). Then onto the diagonal road to Morawa for lunch. On through the rural scenery to Perth.

“Accommodated Tour of the Birdsville Track”

The Birdsville Track was opened in the 1860s to bring cattle from North Queensland and The Northern Territory to the nearest railhead at Port Augusta. This stock route was more than 1000 km shorter than the alternative path to Brisbane.
