

16 DAY WESTERN HALF TOUR

CABIN / MOTEL TOUR

Day 1: We land in Broome, a lovely historic old pearling town and visit Chinatown, the Japanese Cemetery, Roebuck Bay and have a full tour of the town.

Day 2: There is time to explore Broome as you want, perhaps you might like a camel ride on the Beach. We have a fish and chips evening meal watching the sunset over Cable Beach.

Day 3: Up to Derby on the shores of King Sound and the mouth of the mighty Fitzroy River. Derby is a pleasant Kimberley town with streets lined with Boab Trees and many old buildings of its frontier past. We visit the Famous Prison Tree and have a look at the Fitzroy River at Willare Bridge then onto Fitzroy Crossing. In the afternoon we cruise on the tranquil and very beautiful Geikie Gorge. N.B. Geikie Gorge boat trip included.

Day 4: Onto Halls Creek, where gold was first discovered in WA in 1884. Then onto Kununurra where we are based for three nights.

Day 5: This morning we tour the Kimberley's newest town, Kununurra, Hidden Valley, Lake Kununurra, the Diversion Dam and the very productive farmlands. In the afternoon we travel to one of the Kimberley's oldest towns, Wyndham, a town full of W.A. history. We visit a crocodile farm, 5 Rivers Lookout and the wharf. N.B. Crocodile Farm included.

Day 6: Off for a marvellous boat cruise on Lake Argyle this morning. We visit the Durack Homestead and the Spillway. The Ord is spectacular and interesting. The afternoon is free to relax or for those who wish a flight over the Bungle Bungles is available, return to Kununurra. N.B. Boat cruise included. Optional flight over Bungle Bungles not included (approx \$270).

Day 7: A wonderful drive past the very beautiful and remote Victoria River to Katherine on the Katherine River. A service centre for the Central Northern Territory region, a vast area of mainly cattle stations, national parks and Aboriginal lands. We visit Springvale Station, the oldest station in the Territory.

Day 8: A morning boat cruise on spectacular Katherine Gorge. Its off via Pine Creek and Adelaide River with its beautiful War Cemetery to Darwin.

Day 9: In the morning a full tour of Darwin, taking in Battery Point, Fanny Bay and the City Centre. The afternoon is free with optional visit to the Darwin Museum (depicting the events of cyclone Tracey in 1974) and the East Point Military Museum (depicting the bombing raids on Darwin in 1942). N.B. Entry to both museums included in your fare.

Day 10: We travel via the Arnhemland Highway to the Kakadu National Park as well as the mining town of Jabiru. A boat cruise in the afternoon shows us the wonderful variety of wildlife and scenery in the national park. We return to Darwin with a stop for dinner along the way. N.B. Boat cruise included in your fare.

Day 11: South via Adelaide River and Pine Creek to the Mataranka Thermal Pool, an absolutely beautiful spot to relax in these natural springs Further south through the Northern Territory past Larrimah to Daly Waters.

Day 12: An early start through the copper mining town of Tennant Creek, onto the Devils Marbles then Barrow Creek and Central Mt. Stuart, the geographical centre of Australia. To the Alice for two nights.

Day 13: We take you to the original Telegraph Station, then drop you in town for you to wander. Weather permitting you may take an optional balloon trip with Spinifex Ballooning. Cost approx. \$250.

Day 14: Onto the spectacular Standley Chasm and Simpsons Gap. Down to the Lasseter Highway to Curtin Springs on the way to Uluru.

Day 15: An interesting day at Uluru, we wander around it. Visit the Yulara village, view the impressive domes of Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) visit the National Park Display and view the sunset on Uluru. A great day.

Day 16: We fly home after a wonderful tour of Northern Australia.

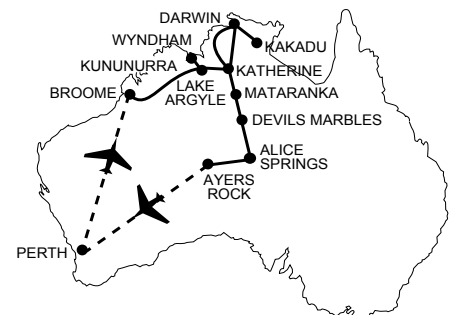
